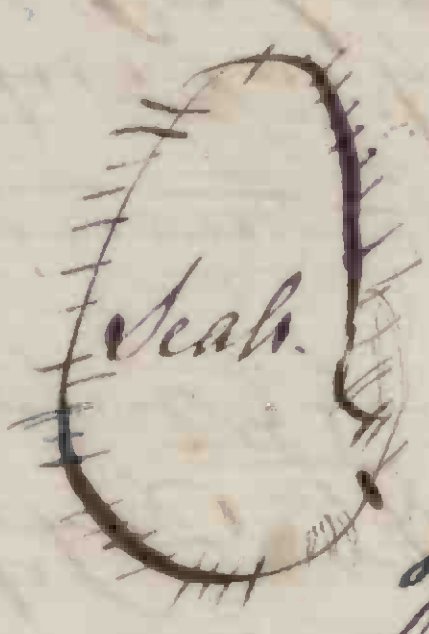


April Anno Domini 1811.
To Mr. Walter Haynes, Constable, of the Town of Sud-
-bury Greeting

 You are hereby Required, in the Name of the
Commonwealth of Massachusetts, to Notify &
warn the Freeholders and other Inhabitants
of said Town, Qualified by Law, to Vote in Town
Meetings, Viz. Such as pay to one single tax, besides the
Poll, or Polls, a sum equal to two thirds of a single
Poll tax, (by posting up a Copy of the Original, agree-
-able to a late Vote of the Town) to assemble at the
Meeting House in said Town, on Monday the first
Day of April Next, at 3 o'clock in the afternoon,
on said Day then & there, to act on the following
articles, Viz.

- 1st To Choose a Moderator
- 2^d To bring in their Votes, for the choice of some
suitable Person for a County Treasurer
- 3^d To fill up Vacancies, in those Town Offices which the
Law requires, should any Office appear to be
Vacant
- 4th To see, if the Town will act upon the (9th 13th and
14th articles in the warning of March Meeting, &
Refer'd to April Meeting, for further Consideration,
- 5th To see, if the Town, will take any, and if any, what
Measures they will take, to procure preaching for the
future, to do - or act, as the Town shall think
best when Mett.
- 6th To see, if the Town, will take any Measures, for the
Purpose of Supporting in part, Mr. Samuel Hunt,
who is become Poor, and stands in Need of relief. to
do - or act &c. &c.
- 7th To see, if the Town, will give any Directions to
their Selectmen, respecting their letting out the
Poor, for the year ensuing, - to do - or act &c. &c.
