

April Anno Domini 1841.

3^d Article made choice of M^r. Walter Haynes, for Constable for the year ensuing - (who was sworn the same evening to the faithful discharge of his office, by the Clerk of the Town)

5th The Question was asked, to see if the Town, would make any Provision for procuring of preaching through the summer season; which being put to vote, passed in the affirmative

— It was then voted to appoint a Com^{tee} for the purpose of procuring some suitable person, or persons, to supply the Desk, said Com^{tee} to consist of three, and the following persons were chosen, viz^t. M^r. Isaac Puffer, Lieut. Hopewell Willis, and Capt. Samuel Puffer Jun^r. were appointed for the purposes aforesaid, — Then M^r. Isaac Puffer, refused serving as one of said Com^{tee}, Capt. Sam^l. Puffer Jr. also refused serving as one of said Com^{tee}, and Lieut. Hopewell Willis, declined accepting his appointment as one of said Committee.

7th Voted, that the Selectmen have discretionary Power to act in behalf of said Town, as they shall think will be most for their Interest as it respects the letting out the Poor, — belonging to said Town.

— Then the Town by this Vote, adjourn'd this Meeting to Thursday the 4th Day of this Instant April at 2 o'clock in the afternoon, to meet at this place.

— Sudbury Thursday April 4th 1841, —
The Town being met at time & place, agreeable to the foregoing adjournment, — proceeded, & took up the

5th article again and voted, to Reconsider the whole of the proceeding, relative to what has been acted upon, under this article, at the last Meeting.
