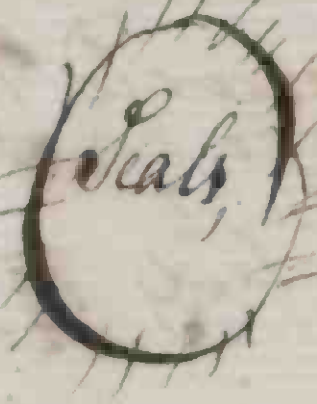


May Anno Domini 1811.

To M^r. Walter Haynes, Constable of the Town of Sud-
bury, in the County of Middlesex, Greeting.

 You are hereby required, in the Name of the Com-
monwealth of Massachusetts, to Notify and warn the
Male Inhabitants, of said Town, being twenty One years
of age & Resident in said Town, for the space of One year
next Preceding, having a Freehold Estate within said
Town, of the annual Income of three Pounds, or any
Estate, to the Value of sixty Pounds, to Meet, at the Meet-
ing-House in said Town, On Monday the 6th Day
of May next at 1 o'clock in the afternoon, for the pur-
pose of choosing a Representative to Represent them
at the general court, appointed to be convened, and held
at Boston, on the last Wednesday of May.

Hereof fail not of Making return of this warrant
with your doings thereon, to One of the Selectmen, previous
to the holding said Meeting.
