You are hereby required in the Name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, to Notify, and warn the Freeholders and other Inhabitants, of said Town Qualified by Law, to Vote, in Town Meetings, Viz Such as pay to one Single Tax besides the Poll, or Polls, a Sum Equal to two thirds of a single Poll tax, to assemble at the Meeting House in said Town, on Monday the 6th Day of May next, at 3 o'clock in the afternoon on said Day, then and there, to act on the following articles Vizt —

1st To Choose a Moderator, and act upon the 9th Article in the warning of March Meeting, and refer to April Meeting and from April to May Meeting for further Consideration —

2^d To Bring in Town Debts and Credit —

3^d To see if the Town, will grant to their Rev^d. Minister his Salary for the year ensuing, to do or act, as the Town think best when Met, —
