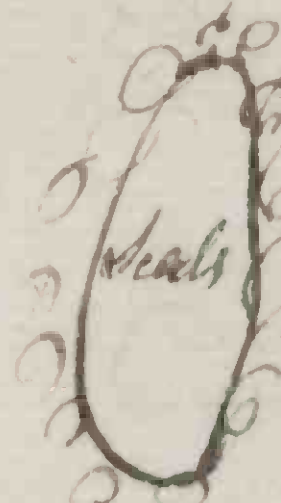


August Anno Domini 1811.

To Mr. Walter Haynes, Constable, of the Town of Sudbury Greeting

 You are hereby required, in the Name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, to Notify, and warn, the Freeholders and other Inhabitants of said Town, Qualified by Law, to Vote in Town affairs, (Viz,) Such as pay to one single Tax besides the Poll, or Poll, a Sum equal to two thirds of a single Poll tax, (by Posting up a Copy of the Original, agreeable to a late order of the Town,) to assemble at the Meeting House in said Town, on Monday the 12th Day of August next at 4 o'clock in the afternoon, on said Day then & there to act on the following articles, Viz.

- 1st To Choose a Moderator,
- 2^d To see, if the Town, will take some suitable Measures for the purpose of Procuring Preaching for the future, it being agreeable to the Petition of Capt. Daniel Bowker and Others, reference thereunto being had, to Do, or act, as the Town shall think when Met,
- 3^d To see, if the Town, will Concur, with the Church of Christ in said Town, in their Proceedings, held on the 3^d Day of July 1811, which is as follows. Viz. Voted to hear Mr. Randal and Mr. Abbott four Sabbaths each, on Probation, it being agreeable to the Request of Mr. Asahel Whittier Jr. to Do - or act, &c &c
