To Mr. Walter Haynes, Constable of the Town of
Sudbury, in the County of Middlesex. — Greeting

That you are hereby required in the Name of the Com-
monwealth of Massachusetts, to Notify & warn the
Male Inhabitants of said Town, being twenty One
years of age and resident in said Town for the
space of One year next preceding, having a free
hold Estate within said Town of the annual In-
come of three Pounds or any Estate to the Value
of Sixty Pounds, to assemble at the Meeting-House
in said Town, on Monday the 23^d Day of this Instant
Sept^r at 1 o'clock in the afternoon, to give in their Votes
for One Representative that is an Inhabitant of the
Middlesex District, to Represent them in the Congress
of the United States of America, in the room of the
Hon^{ble} Joseph B. Varnum (who has vacated his seat
in the House of Representatives, by accepting a seat
in the Senate

— You are also Required, to Notify and warn
the Freeholders, and Other Inhabitants of said Town,
Qualified as the Law directs to Vote, in Town affairs to
Meet, at the above-mentioned place, at 2 o'clock in the after-
noon, on said Day, to act on the following articles,

- 2^d To see, if the Town will take any Measures, for the

prisoned in Concord Goal, to do, or act as the Town
shall think proper when Met,

the road near Capt. Jonathan Bents, to do, or act &c
