of Sixty Pounds, to assemble at the Meeting House in said Town
on Monday the 4th Day of November next at 12 o'clock at
noon, to give in their Votes, for one Representative that is an
Inhabitant of the Middlesex District, to represent them in the
Congress of the United States of America, in the room of the
Hon^{ble} Joseph B. Varnum, who has vacated his seat in the House
of Representatives by accepting a seat in the Senate —
— Hereof you are Not to fail, of making return of this
Warrant, with your doings thereon, to One of the Selectmen
Previous to the Opening said Meeting —
