Sudbury Monday Nov^r 4th 1811.

At a Legal Town Meeting held in Sudbury on the Day and Year abovesaid, the Qualified Voters proceeded to bring in their Votes for the choice of a Representative to Represent them in the Congress of the United States

— Then the Town, agreeable to adjournment, Resumed this Meeting again, and brought in their Votes for the choice of a Representative as follows — Viz^t —
