the 4th Day of May 1812, Proceeded to the business of
said Day, by bringing in their votes, for the choice of a
Representative and William Huntley being a Freehol-
der, and resident in said Town, was made choice of to
serve for, and Represent said Town, in General Court, for the
year ensuing, having the Number of — 62 Votes.
