To Mr. Walter Haynes, Constable of the Town of Sud-
bury, in the County of Middlesex, — Greeting —

LR You are hereby required in the Name of the
LR Commonwealth of Massachusetts, to Notify, and
LR Warn, the Freeholders, and other Inhabitants of the
LR Town of Sudbury, Qualified by Law, to Vote in Town
affairs, to Meet, at the Meeting House in said
Town, on Thursday the 28 Day of this Instant May, at
2 o'clock in the afternoon, on said Day then and there
to act on the following articles, Viz —

1st To Choose a Moderator

2^d To See what encouragement the Town will give to
this Towns proportion of soldiers, which are called upon
by government, to hold themselves in readiness at
a minutes warning, and grant a suitable sum of Mo-
ney, to defray the expense of the same, it being agre-
able to the request of Capt. Israel Haynes, to do or
act, as the Town shall think most proper when
met,

3^d To See, if the Town, will take any Measures for the
purpose of New running over, such of the Towns Sto-
ck of Leadn Balls, as will not answer the Law
to do or act &c &c

And you are not to fail of making return of this
Warrant, with your doings thereon, to one of the Se-
lectmen, previous to the opening said Meeting —
Given under our hands, and Seal, at Sudbury, this
16th Day of May A.D. 1812
