At a Legal Town Meeting held in Sudbury on Monday the 2^d Day of November, 1812. Proceeded to the business of said Day, by bringing in their Votes for the choice of a Representative to Represent them in the Congress of the United States, as follows, Viz

To Mr. Walter Haynes, Constable of the Town of Sudbury, in the County of Middlesex. Greeting

You are hereby required in the Name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, to Notify & warn the male Inhabitants of said Town being Twenty One years of age, & Resident in said Town, for the space of One year next preceding, having a Freehold Estate within said Town, of the annual Income of Three Pounds, or any Estate to the Value of Sixty Pounds to Assemble at the Meeting House, in said Town, on Thursday the 12th Day of this Instant Nov^r, at 10 o'Clock, in the afternoon, to give in their Votes, for five Electors (in the Counties of Suffolk, Essex, & Middlesex) of President and Vice President, of the United States, of America — It being agreeable to a Resolve of the Senate & House of Representatives, of this Commonwealth, passed

October, 21st 1812
— you are also Required to Notify and warn the Freeholders, and other Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury Qualified as the Law directs, to Vote in Town affairs, to Meet, at the abovementioned place at 2 o'Clock, in the Afternoon, on said day — then — to
