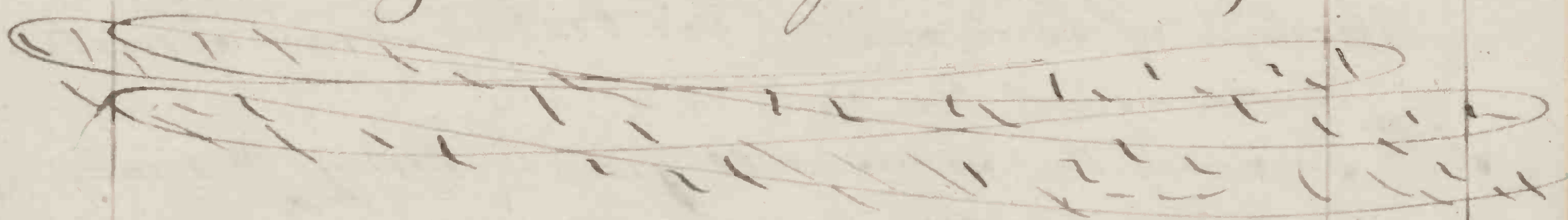
Allowed To Mr. Thomas Fisk, for taking care the Meet-^{ing} H^{ouse} from May 1812, to May 1813 -

A. E. School House \$1.50 for spelling book \$1.20
& a reader \$1.34 for staple & latch \$1.18 - 1.22
