Then the Town by their vote adjourned this Meeting
to the 1st Monday in September next at 3 o'clock
in the afternoon to meet at this place

foregoing adjournment provided & took up the
4th Art: & by their vote passed over this article

6th put over to the next Town Meeting

7th The Town by their vote appointed Mr. Ezekiel H. Lo-
ring, as an agent to appear in behalf of the In-
habitants of said Town, at the Court of Sessions
next to be holden at Concord, in & for the County
of Middlesex, on the third Tuesday of Sept: Instant
to oppose the acceptance of said road as prayed for,
and the order for the same to be recorded, in the
Town Book of Sudbury, as set forth in said Wre-
sters Petition
