To Mr. Walter Hays, Constable of the Town of Sudbury in
the County of Middlesex.

You are hereby required in the name of the Common-

Law of Massachusetts, to notify, and warn, the freeholders

and other Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury, Qualifie by

law, to vote, in Town Meetings, to Assemble, at the Meeting-

house, in said Town, on Monday the 7th Day of March next,

at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, on said day, then & there to

act on the following articles, Viz.

1st To choose a Moderator, Town Clerk, Selectmen, Town Treas-

urers, Constables, and all other Town officers, required by

law to be annually chosen, in the Months of March, or

April

2^d To see, if the Town will repair their Highways, by a vote

the present year, and grant a suitable Sum of Money,

for repairing the same

3^d To see, if the Town will give liberty for swine to go at

large the present year,

4th To see, if the Town, will give liberty, for Horses, mules, &

horned cattle to go at large, the present year,

5th To see, if the Town will give liberty for sheep to go

at large, from the 15th Day of March to the first day of

May next,

6th To see, if the Town, will accept the Settlement of the

Selectmen, with their late Treas. & Accts., also with their

present Town Treas., and order the same to be recorded,

7th To see, if the Town will take Measures, for the purpose

of agreeing with some suitable person, or persons, to

collect the taxes assessed upon the Inhabitants of said

Town, for the year ensuing; to do, or act as the Town

shall think best when met,

8th To see, if the Town, will appoint some suitable

persons, for a School Committee, and authorize them

to agree with, and hire School Instructors to instruct

the
