5th Granted to Mr. Timothy Hilliard, as a settlement the sum of \$500.00 of \$600, provided he settles with us as our Minister

6th = for the support of a Grammar School the sum of \$300.00 for the year ensuing to be equally divided between the five districts - 300.00

7th = for the support of a Reading & writing school the sum of \$100 for the year ensuing to be equally divided between the five districts - 100.00

= also to supply the several school districts with wood the sum of \$25.00 to be equally divided between said school districts - 25.00

8th = Passed over for the present - - - - - 25.00

9th = To pay their Treasurer the sum of \$10.00 - - - - - 10.00

To pay their Officers the sum of \$20.00 - - - - - 20.00

10th = Directed their Selectmen to agree with some suitable person to perform the services of taking care of and sweeping the Meeting the Meeting-House and ringing the bell &c as they shall Judge most for the Interest of the Town.

11th = Passed over, and not acted upon - - - - -

12th = Voted to appoint a Committee, for the purpose expressed in this article, viz^t for draughting an Instrument, to indemnify ^{right} the Town, from Mr. Timothy Hilliards having any claim upon the Ministerial Land in said Town, said Committee to consist of three, and the following persons were appointed viz^t William Rice Esq^r Col^o Jon^a Rice, & Ruben Maynard, - - - - -

13th = Directed their Selectmen to make such repairs to the pulpit as they shall Judge necessary to make it appear decent, and to bring their accounts to the Town for allowance - - - - -

14th = Voted, to choose a Committee, for the purpose of carrying into effect, what is expressed under this article, Namely, the repairing & refreshing with the body and gallery, of the Meeting-House, said Committee to consist of four and the following Persons were chosen, viz^t Lieut. Jesse Moore Mr. Eben^r Parmenter, Deacon Puffer & Mr. Abel Whaler; - also Voted, that the several Pub
