18th Attended to the report of the Committee appointed in April 1813 for the purpose of calling upon the several delinquent Surveyors of Highways, who reported there was the sum of \$176. 60, which appeared to be due from the several Surveyors of Highways for five years previous to the year 1813, which report was accepted, and said Committee were directed and authorized, to call upon the several delinquent Surveyors of Highways, to cause whatever Money remained in their hands to be immediately expended upon the highways, within their respective limits, or otherwise their taxes to be collected, as the law, in that case hath made and provided,

— Attended to the report of their Treasurer, who stated, that there was in the Treasury, the sum of \$180 or \$181 of unappropriated Money, which he wished to be directed by the Town in what way was most eligible to dispose of said Money, as the value of bank bills was so great as it respects the discount & he wished not to have them lay on his hands — — — — — then the Town took up the

13th Article again and Appropriated the aforesaid sum of \$180 or \$181, as above reported, for the purpose of making such necessary repairs to the pulpit &c. as to have it appear decent, and the remainder, to be appropriated for the purpose of defraying the expense that has arisen for hiring preaching, where there has no provision been made for that purpose

— Then the Town adjourned this Meeting to the first Monday in September^{next} at 4 o'clock in the afternoon, to meet at this place,
