Sudbury Monday Sept. 5th 1814.

The Town being Met, agreeable to the foregoing adjournment, proceeded to the business of said and took up the

18th attended to the report of the Committee appointed under this warrant, for the purpose of taking a Duplicate of the claim Due of Mr. Timothy Hilliard, of the Ministerial Lands in said Town — who reported they had paid said Due, and presented the same before the Town for their inspection, which after being read was accepted, and ordered the same to be recorded, on the Towns Book for Recording Deeds

also reported the situation of the Cause respecting the widow Rice, as it now stands, — and respecting John Oliver, formerly
