4th To See, if the Town, will give any encouragement (more
than what Government has given) to this Towns pro-
= portion of Soldiers, who have been detached for the term
of three Months, and grant a suitable sum of Money
for the same — also what encouragement, to this Towns
proportion of Soldiers, for the next detachment, which it is
said are about to be raised, to do, or act, &c &c

warrant, with your doings thereon, to one of the Select-
= men, previous to the Opening said Meeting.
