At a Legal Town Meeting held by the Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury, duly Qualified, to vote for Representatives in the General Court, of this Commonwealth, holden in Said Town, on Monday the 7th Day of Nov^r. A.D. 1814, Votes for the following persons, to Represent the people of Said Commonwealth in the Congress of the United States, for the Middlesex district, were given in as follows, V^t — — — —

Hon^{ble} Asahel Stearns twenty one Votes
Col^l Jonathan Rice one Vote

Then the Town by their Vote, Dissolved this Meeting —

— You are hereby required in the Name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, to Notify & warn the Freeholders and other Inhabitants, of the Town of Sudbury, Qualified by Law, to vote, in Town affairs, to assemble at the Meeting House in Said Town, on Monday the 7th Day of Nov^r. Next, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon, on said Day, then and there, to act on the following articles V^t — — — —

1st To Choose a Moderator, — — — —

2^d To see, if the Town will Grant the sum of thirty five Dollars, to reimburse to those persons who have advanced that sum, by way of a bounty to this Towns proportion of soldiers, which were de-
