fy said Ben^g for the Interest, which he has paid on the
Bond above mentioned, and have his receipt for the sa-
me, — also have taken the opinion of Sam^l Hoar Jr^r
Esq^r respecting the demand the Inhabitants of said
Town have against L^t Peter Smith, — who states that said
Smith being considered in law, as a pauper, at the time
when the debt was contracted, was therefore Incapable of
making contracts, for to defray the expenses of his board, it
was therefore his opinion that the Town must be holden
for his support, although he may have properly fallen into
his Popishion since that period sufficient to reimburse
the Town, the expenses incurred whilst he was in prison, —
