

April Anno Domini 1815.

To Lieut. Jesse Moore, Constable of the Town of Sudbury,
in the County of Middlesex, — Greeting —
— you are hereby required in the Name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, to Notify & warn, all the Inhabitants of said Town, Qualified by the Constitution of this Commonwealth, to Vote, in the choice of Representatives, — and all others Qualified as the Law directs, to Vote, in Town affairs, to Assemble at the Meeting House in said Town, on Monday the 3^d day of April next at 3 o'clock in the afternoon, on said Day, then & there to act on the following articles Viz^t

- 1st To Choose a Moderator.
- 2^d To bring in their Votes, for some suitable person for a County Treas^r for the year ensuing
- 3^d To fill vacancies, in those Town Offices, which the Law requires, should any office appear to be Vacant.
- 4th To see, if the Town will authorize their Surveyors of Highways, for the year ensuing, to collect the Money of those who shall refuse, or neglect, to work out their Tapes when called upon by their respective Surveyors to do — or act, as the Town shall think best when met.
- 5th To see, if the Town, will give any directions to their Assessors, respecting their going to the several persons Houses belonging to said Town, for the purpose of their taking the Invoice of their rateable Estate for the year ensuing, to do, or act, &c. &c.
- 6th To see if the Town will, agreeable to the request of Mr. Abel Wheeler Jun^r, and Others, make an additional Grant of Money, for the purpose of repairing their Highways, for the year ensuing, to do or act.
- 7th To attend to any, or all reports to be made by Committees
