Se, you are hereby required, in the Name of the Common-
Se, wealth of Massachusetts, to notify & warn, the male Inhabi-
Se, tants of said Town, being twenty one years of age, and resid-
Se, ent in said Town, for the Space of One year next pre-
ceding, having a freehold Estate within said Town, of the
annual Income of three pounds, or any Estate to the Va-
lue of sixty pounds, to meet at the Meeting House, in said
Town, on Monday the 1st Day of May next at 10 o'clock in
the afternoon, for the purpose of choosing a Representative,
to Represent them, in the General Court, appointed to
be convened, and held at Boston, on the last Wednesday
of May next,

— Hereof you are not to fail of making return of this
Warrant with your doings thereon to one of the Selectmen
previous to the opening said Meeting.
