2^d Article Allowed accounts, as they stand hereafter recorded, —

3^d Granted, as a salary to the Rev^d Mr. Bigelow, the sum of $\$246.67$ for the year ensuing — $\$246.67$

4th Granted to the Rev^d Mr. Hilliard, the sum of $\$500$, for the year ensuing — $\$500.00$

5th Granted, for the support of a Grammar School, for the year ensuing the sum of $\$300$, to be equally divided between the five School districts — $\$300.00$

— The Question was then put, to see if the Town would reconsider the last Grant & it pass^d in the negative

6th Granted, for the support, of a reading & writing School for the year ensuing the sum of $\$100$, to be equally divided between the five School districts, $\$100.00$

— Also Granted, to supply the schools with wood the year ensuing the sum of $\$25$, to be equally divided between the five districts — $\$25.00$

7th Granted for the support of the Poor, belonging to said Town, for the year ensuing the sum of $\$1000$, —

8th Granted to pay their Taxes the present year the sum of $\$10$, — $\$10.00$
To pay their Assessors the sum of $\$20$, — $\$20.00$

9th Directed their Selectmen, to agree with some suitable person to take care of & sweep the Meeting House, & ring the bell &c. as express^d in this article —

10th pass^d over for the present, —

11th pass^d over for the present. —

12th Vote to appoint a Committee, for the purpose of examining into the situation of the Bell dale and Meeting House, as mentioned in this article & to report to the Town their Opinion, what repairs appear to be necessary to be made, & the following Gentlemen were chosen, Viz^t William Hunt Esq^r Mr. Jeddiah Thompson, & Eben^r Plympton Esq^r —

13th Appropriated whatever sum of Money. was Surplus, upon the Grants of 1814, for the
