

May Anno Domini 1815.
Then the Town Voted to adjourn this Meeting to this Day week
at 1 o'clock, in the afternoon, to meet at this place.

Sudbury Monday September 11th 1815.

The Town being met at time & place agreeable to the
foregoing adjournment, provided to ^{the} business of the Day
5th Article, took up this article, and Granted the sum of \$
\$75. for the support of a Grammar School in ad-
dition to the grant already made, for the year ensue-
ing to be equally divided, between the five districts \$75.

6th Article, Granted, the sum of \$25. in addition to the grant
already made for the support of a reading & writing-
School for the year ensuing, to be equally divided
between the five school districts \$25.

4th article Then the Town took up this article, & Voted to reconsider
the Grant of \$500, made to the Rev^d Mr. Willard, at a former
Meeting, under this article, — and Granted the sum of
\$145. to pay the Rev^d Mr. Willard, for his services from
the 1st June 1815, to the present time. — \$145.

— also Granted, the sum of \$355. for the purpose
of hiring preaching, the remainder part of the year
ensuing \$355.

— It was then Voted, to appoint a Committee for the
purpose of providing some suitable person, to preach
with us a short term of time, and the Selectmen were
chosen for that purpose, and directed to procure preaching
on ^{the} next Sabbath if conveniently obtained, —
and unless such time as the Town might be called toge-
ther to express their minds, respecting procuring preachers
— ing for the future.
