

May Anno Domini 1815,

bell duck, and meeting-house, reported as follows vizt

"The Committee appointed for the purpose of examining into the situation of the bell duck and Meeting-house, have attended that service, and have to report, — your Committee find by examination the bell duck to be very leaky, in consequence of this leakage, some of the timbers below the duck are very rotten, it is the opinion of your committee, that the bell duck, in order to make it secure, be raised to a pitch of two ninths, then shingled and leaded round the posts, or spider legs, that a new girt be put into the Tower, Next over the pews in said Tower, in lieu of the old one, which appears to be rotten and some small repairs are necessary to be made in the plastering and in some of the windows of the Meeting-house,"

Then the Town by their vote,

appointed, & authorized the Committee aforesaid to provide as soon as conveniently may be, to make such repairs as they shall think necessary to said bell duck & Meeting-house agreeable to their report,

also Granted the sum of \$100, for the purpose of repairing said Meeting-house & the Committee to be accountable for the expenditure of the same — \$100, "

11th article, then the Town took up this article, and accepted the road, as laid out by the Selectmen, Near Mr. Benj^a Smiths, through said Smiths land, as mentioned in this article, — also Granted the sum of \$200 for the purpose of compensating Mr. Asa Smith, for his making said road, & fencing upon one side (if he thought best,) & for the bridge which is now built, said road to be made and supported for the term of ten years, by said —
