6th The Town by their Vote, appropriated out of the Expention obtained against the Inhabitants of East Sudbury a sum sufficient to pay the demands of the County Treasurer, as expressed under this article, which demand is supposed to be about One hundred and forty two dollars, - \$142 -

To Mr. Walter Haynes, Constable of the Town of Sudbury in the County of Middlesex - Greeting -

Whereas you are hereby required in the name of the Common-wealth of Massachusetts, to notify and warn, the Freeholders, and other Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury qualified by law, to vote, in Town Meetings, to assemble at the Meeting-House in said Town, on Monday the 4th Day of March next, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, on said Day, then & there to act on the following articles, VIZ -

1st To Choose a Moderator, Town Clerk, Selectmen, Town Treasurers, Assessors, Constables, & all other Town Officers, required by law, to be annually chosen in the Months of March, or April, -

2^d To see, if the Town will repair their Highways by a rate, the present year, and Grant a suitable sum of Money, for repairing the same -

3^d To see, if the Town will give liberty for swine to go at large the present year, -

4th To see, if the Town will give liberty for Horses, Mules, and that Cattle, to go at large the present year, -

5th To see, if the Town will give liberty for sheep to go at large without being under the care of a Shepherd the present year, -

6th To see, if the Town, will accept the settlement of the Selectmen with the Town Treas^r and order the same to be recorded -

7th To see, if the Town will take measures for the purpose of agreeing with some suitable person or persons, to collect the Taxes
