in writing, as it respects the Measure of the land, and the conditions upon which it can be obtained. —
4th the 6th article in the warning of March Meeting, as contained in this, 4th article, accepted the settlement, of the Selectmen, with the Town Treasurers, and ordered the same to be recorded, —
= 7th article, in the warning of March Meeting, as contained in this 4th article passed over, —
= 10th article in the warning of March Meeting as contained in this 4th article Referred, to May Meeting for further consideration,
3^d article, took up this article, and the Question was put, to see if the Town would reconsider the vote for letting out the office of constable, to the highest bidder, & being put to vote it passed in the negative, —
= It was then voted, that whosoever bid off, the office of Constable should previous to his being qualified to that office, (if he should be chosen) be subjected to pay, whatever sum, it was bid off at, to the Clerk of the Town, — and Mr. Ezekiel H. Loring being the highest bidder, bid it off, at One dollar & twenty five cents, —
= Then the Town by their vote, made choice of Mr. John Brown for their Constable, for the year ensuing, — It was then voted, that if Mr. Brown, was qualified, to said office, he should not be subjected to pay the premium, that it was bid off at, —
= & B. Mr. Brown, was sworn to the faithful discharge of his office by the clerk of the Town, on April 22^d. —
