8th Article Granted, the sum of \$300, for the Pur-
-pose of Hiring some suitable person, or persons
to supply their pulpit, for the year ensuing \$300.00

9th The Town by their vote, directed the select-
-men to agree with some suitable person, to take
care of, sweep the meeting-house, ring the
Bell, and dig graves, as occasion may require
for the year ensuing, ---

10th Exempted Mr. Thomas R. Plympton, (by vote of
the Town) from his Highway taxes, until such
time as the Town shall open a road to his land,
as excepted under this article ---

11th Appropriated, out of the Money, which the Town
obtained against the Inhabitants, of East Sud-
bury, in their late law suit, for the support
of the widow Elizabeth Rice the sum of
\$100.00 for the purpose of taking up out-
standing Orders, due Mr. Benjⁿ Dudley &
others to the above amount, ---

12th Accepted, the list of Jurors, as presented by
the selectmen, ---

13th Paid Over, ---

14th Paid over for the present, ---

15th Paid Over for the present. ---

16th The Town by their vote, directed their Surveyors
of highways, that had not expended the amount of
the whole of their Money, upon their several limits
to work out the remainder as soon as may be
and with all convenient speed, ---

18th Then the Town took up this article & attended to the
report of their committee appointed for the pur-
-pose of looking out a suitable spot of ground
