— Also the Town by their Vote, Granted the sum of One hundred Dollars, for the purpose of purchasing the aforesaid land of M^r. Walter Haynes, agreeable to their Committee report, \$100:00

15. Then the Town took up this article again, and by their Vote, accepted the road as laid out by the Selectmen near M^r. Jon^s. Smiths, as expressed in this article, —
— Also Granted the sum of \$55.00 to compensate M^r. Arabel Smith, for the damage done him in having the road laid out through his land, as far as to M^r. Huntings & Co. land, — \$55.00
