upon, — It was then voted, to appoint a committee, for the purpose of conferring, with those three Gent^{les}, which the Town voted to hear on probation, said Com^{tee} to consist of five, & to act either in a separate, or corporate Capacity, & the following Gent^{les} were chosen, Viz^t: Cole Rice, Eben^r: Plympton Esq^r: M^r: Daniel Osborn, Deacon Puffer, & M^r: John Brown, — then M^r: Osborn declined serving on said Com^{tee} & M^r: Cha^s: Willis was chosen in his stead, then M^r: Willis declined serving & M^r: Elijah Jones was chosen in his room,

3^d Article passed Over,

4th Voted to appropriate a sum of Money, sufficient (out of the Grant, for repairing the Bell duck &c.) sufficient, for the purpose of procuring cloath enough for a burying cloath for said Town — also by their vote, directed William Hunt Esq^r to purchase said cloaths, as soon as conveniently may be

5th the Question was put, to see, if the Town would appoint a Com^{tee} for the purpose express in this article, & being put to vote, it passed in the Negative

6th Voted, to appoint a Com^{tee} to consist of three, for to examine the Stove mentioned in this article, and to report to the Town their Opinion, at the adjournment of May Meeting, which is on the 1st Sept. next, — Com^{tee} chosen were Deacon Puffer, Capt. Israel Haynes, & Capt. Abel Cutting,

7th Article Passed Over, not to be acted upon —
— Then the Town by their vote, Dissolved this Meeting,
