At a Legal Town meeting held by the Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury, duly Qualified to vote, for Representatives in the General court of this Commonwealth, holden in said Town on Monday the 4th Day of Nov^r: AD 1816, Votes for the following persons, to Represent the people of said Commonwealth in the Congress of the United States, for the Middlesex district, were given in as follows Viz^t—

To Mr. John Brown, Constable of the Town of Sudbury in the County of Middlesex, — Greeting —
You are hereby required in the Name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, to notify and warn the Freeholders, & other Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury, Qualified by Law, to vote, in Town Meetings, to assemble at the Meeting-House in said Town, on Monday the 4th Day of Nov^r: Next at 3 o'Clock in the Afternoon, on said Day then & there, to act on the following articles, Viz^t—

- 1st To Choose a Moderator,
- 2^d To see, if the Town, will take any, & if any what Measures they will take, for the purpose of disposing of their Ministerial lands in said Town, to do, or act, as the Town shall think best when met,
- 3^d To see, if the Town, will take any Measures, for the purpose of the better regulating the going in & coming out of the Meeting-House upon the Lords-days, & also to prevent the people from filling up the porch,
