- To Mr John Brown Constable of the Town of Sudbury in
in the County of Middlesex — Greetings
- you are hereby required in the name of the Common-
wealth of Massachusetts to notify and warn all the Inhabitants
of said Town qualified by the Constitution of this Commonwealth
to vote in the choice of Representatives — and otherwise quali-
fied as the Law directs to vote in Town affairs to assemble
at the Meeting house in said town on Monday the 7th day of
April next at the 3 o'clock in the afternoon then
their to act on the following articles (Viz)
- 1st To choose a Moderator —
 - 2^d To bring in their votes for sume suitable person
for a County Treas^r for the year in ensuing
 - 3^d To fill vacancies in those Town officers which the Law
requires, should any office appear to be vacant
 - 4th To see if the Town will act upon the 1st, 6th, 10th, 12th & 13th
articles in the morning of March Meeting & referred to
April Meeting for further consideration —
 - 5th To see if the Town will agree to have to have the Ordina-
tion Sermon printed at the expense of the Town and appoint
a Committee for that purpose to do or act —
 - 6th To see if the Town will appoint a suitable number of
persons as trustees to be named in a bill of incorporar-
tion for the purpose of selling the Ministerial Land,
in Sudbury, and to manage the fund arising from the
Sale of said Land, to do or act —
 - 7th To see if the Town will or therise their Committee that
was appointed to sell the old Training field near
Jonathan Clark to give a Deed or deed, to do or act —
 - 8th To see if the Town will at the request of Mr David Trull
open the Road near Mr Henry Sudley, so far as said
Trull Land, extends to do or act —
 - 9th To see if the Town will discount to Constable
Haynes & Moore such Taxes as they shall offer
to do or act —
 - 10th To see if the Town will dispose of a piece of wood land
near Mr Gleason and appoint a Committee to sell
and pass Deed, &c —
 - 11th To see if the Town will by their vote admit Peter
Parmenter Labourer who for many years past has
resided in the Town of East Sudbury to be an Inhabitant
of the Town of Sudbury; or otherwise to appoint an
agent or agents to defend the right Inhabited by East
Sudbury against Sudbury —
