Then the Town by their vote excepted of the Report of the
Committee for selling the old Training field near
Jon^{as} Clark

Your Committee which were appointed for the
purpose of selling the old Training field so called
near ~~the~~ Jon^{as} Clark, have attended to that service
and ask leave to report as follows viz

That on the 31st day of March last past, sell at public
Tender, all the land, that is enumerated within the
plan, of the aforesaid Training field, reserving
only a two rod Highway through each way where
the Road is now traveled the plan of said land says
six acres, and a four rod Highway through ~~the~~ ^{the}
before stated, your Committee thought, that two
rod Highway would be as much as is necessary, for
the use of the Town, The land was bid off by M^r Isaac
Hunt, to be measured to him at 30 dollars per acre,
ten percent paid down, and the remainder in
two years, with good and approved notes with ~~interest~~
Interest yearly,

Then the Town, took up the 10th article in the warning
of March Meeting as contained in the 4th article & referred
to April Meeting for further consideration
the Town voted to appropriate to M^r Walter Hays
a sum of money sufficient to pay the execution the
Town of Stow obtained against the Town of Sudbury out of
the surplus money granted in 1816 & money granted
for the repairs of the Bell dock
