At a Town Meeting legally held in Sudbury
on Monday the 5th day of May 1817. proceeded
to the business of said day, ~~by bringing in there~~
it was moved & seconded ^{for} to it the Town would ^{send} a repre-
sentative the present year and it passed in affirmation
~~then~~ proceeded to bring in their votes for the choice
of a representative and William Hunt Esq. being
a freeholder & resident in said Town was made
choice of, to serve & represent said Town in General
Court, for the year ensuing, having the number of
thirty six votes, Capt. Isaac Gibb four votes At Knebs
Maynard one vote & Abel Wheeler one vote ---
Then the Town by their vote dissolved this Meeting.

6th To see if the Town will grant Money for the relief
of the poor belonging to said Town for the year
ensuing to do, or, act &c. -
