you are hereby required in the Name of the Com-
mon-wealth of Massachusetts, to notify & warn, all the
Inhabitants of Said Town, Qualified by law, as is provided
in the constitution of this Common-wealth, to vote, in the
choise of Gov^r. Lieut Gov^r. & Venators, for the year en-
suing, to assemble at the Meeting House, in Said Town,
on Monday the 6th day of April Next, at 1. o'clock, in the
Afternoon, on Said Day, then & there, to give in their
votes, for the choise of Gov^r. & Lieut Gov^r. of Said Com-
mon-wealth, & Venators for Meddewp district for the
year ensuing,

— Hereof you are not to fail of making return of this war-
rant, with your doings thereon to some one of the Se-
nators previous to the opening Said meeting, —

said this 23rd Day of March, AD, 1818,
