To Middlesex Co. To Mr. Walter Hayes, Constable of the Town
of Sudbury, in said County, Greeting

— you are hereby required in the Name of the Com-
monwealth of Massachusetts, to notify & warn all
the Inhabitants of said Town, Qualified by the constitution of
this Commonwealth, to Vote, in the choice of Representatives,
and all others Qualified as the law directs to Vote in Town
affairs, to assemble at the meeting-House in said Town, on Monday
the 6th Day of April Next, at three o'clock in the afternoon
on said day, to act on the following articles, Viz;

1st To Choose a Moderator,

2^d To bring in their votes for some suitable person for a
County Treasurer, for the year ensuing

3^d To fill Vacancies in those Town offices, which the law re-
quires should any office appear to be Vacant,

4th To see, if the Town, will act upon the 6th 7th 9th & 10th ar-
ticles in the warning of March Meeting, and refer to April
meeting for further consideration, to, do or act, as the Town
shall think best when met,

5th To attend to any, or all reports, to be made by committees

Should any reports be offered to be made
6th To see, if the Town, will appropriate the Surplus Money arise-
ing upon the assessments on the grant of 1817, for the pur-
pose of making up the deficiency, on the grant for the Sup-
port of the Poor, for said year, to do or act &c

7th To see, if the Town will take any measures, for disposing
of the land left for a Highway, through the lands of Mr.
Obadiah Perry, Cole River and others, said way being on the
Northerly Side of the County road leading from Sudbury, to
the Northerly part of Marlboro; it being agreeable to the re-
quest of Mr. Asa Willis, to do, or act. &c

Warrant, with your doings thereon, to some one of
the Selectmen previous to the Opening said Meeting
