The Committee which was appointed for the purpose of selling the old training field near M^r. Jonathan Clarks, have attended to that service, and ask leave to report as follows V^{er}gⁿ. -

The committee proceeded and sold said land at public Vendue on the 31st day of March 1817, to M^r. Jason Bent, for the sum of thirty Dollars, per acre, containing as per plan, Seven acres, amounting in the whole to the Sum of - \$210.00
