ss monwealth of Massachusetts to notify and warn
ss the male inhabitants of the said town of Sudbury
ss duly qualified by Law to vote for Representative in the
ss General Court of said Commonwealth being twenty
one years of age and upwards and resident in said town
for the space of one year next preceding having a
freehold estate within said town of the annual
income of three pounds or any estate to the value
of sixty pounds To Meet and assemble at the Meeting
House in said town on Monday the second day
of December next (it being ^{the} first Monday of said
Month) at one o'clock in the afternoon to give
in their votes for a Representative of the people
of said Commonwealth in the Congress of the
United States for the Middlesex District —

of this warrant with your doing, there or to
some one of the selectmen previous to the opening
said Meeting — — — — —
