At a Town Meeting Legally held in Sudbury on Monday the 5th day of May, A.D. 1819 proceeded to the business of said day by bringing in their votes for a Moderator and
 1st William Hunt Esq^r was chosen —

2^d Paff over for the present —

3^d Granted to the Reverend Rufus Hurbutt \$459 = 95 with the Interest on the Ministerial fund for his salary the

year ensuing amounting in the whole to the sum of 650 00
 4th Granted for the support of a Grammar school the year ensuing \$375 = to be equally divided among the five school Districts — 375 00

5th Granted for the support of a reading and writing schools the year ensuing the sum of \$150 = — 150 00
 to be equally divided among the five school Districts
 Also granted \$25 = for wood to be equally divided among the five school Districts — 25 00

6th Granted for the support of the poor belonging to said Town for the year ensuing — 1000 00

7th Granted to pay their Taxes the present year the sum of — 10 00

Also their Assessors the sum of — 20 00

8th The Town by their vote directed the selectmen to give with some Antible persons to take care of sweep the Meeting House ring the bell and dig graves as occasions may require for the year ensuing —

9th Containing the 5th article in the warning of April Meeting and referred to May Meeting for further consideration, it was moved & voted to see if the Town would take any measures affecting this article and it passed in the Affirmative —

Also containing the 6th Article in the warning of April Meeting & referred to May ^{Meeting} for further consideration
 Granted for the purpose of making ^{and repairing} the new Road near Mr. May's it is the sum of \$15 = 00 — 15 00

then ~~the selectmen~~ ^{the selectmen} voted to have an agent appointed to superintend the laying out of said Grant and
 Mr. Micah Balcom was chosen for that purpose —

10th The Town voted to choose an agent as was directed in this ~~10th~~ article and Mr. John Brown was chosen for that purpose —
