Middlesex Co. To Mr. Samuel Knight Constable of the Town
of Sudbury in said County — Greeting

You are hereby required in the Name of the Common
wealth of Massachusetts, to notify & warn all the Inhabitants
of said Town Qualified by the Constitution of this Common-
wealth to vote in the choice of Representatives and all other
Qualified as the Law directs to vote in Town affairs to
assemble at the Meeting House in said Town on Monday
the 3^d day of April next at Three O'clock in the after-
noon on said day to act on the following Articles viz

1st To choose a Moderator —

2^d To bring in their votes for some suitable person for
a County Treasurer for the year ensuing —

3^d To fill vacancies in those Town officers which the Law
requires should any officer appear to be dead —

4th To see if the Town will act upon the 6th 10th & 11th Articles
in the warning of March Meeting & referred to April for
further consideration —

5th To see if the Town will take any Measures to furnish
a stove in the Meeting House in said Town, agreeable
to the request of Mr May to do or act as the Town shall
think best when met —

6th To see if the Town will supply the Militia soldiers with

Powder & give them a Dinner when^{ever} they are Obliged
to Muster, agreeable to the request of the Commanding
Officers of the Companies in said Town to do or act as the
Town shall think best —

Hereof you are not to fail of making returns of this
Warrant with your doing, thereon to some one
of the Selectmen previous to the Opening said
Meeting —
