of Sudbury in the County of Middlesex & Commonwealth
of Massachusetts, qualified by the Constitution to vote for
representation of the general Court, holden on the
sixth day of November, being the first Monday of said Month &
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and twenty, for the purpose of giving in their votes
for one Elector for the Middlesex district and two other
Electors at large, for the purpose of electing a President
and Vice President of the United States, the whole number
of votes given in were sorted, counted, recorded and
declarations thereof made as by the resolve directed
