Whereas the Hon^{ble} Samuel Knight Constable of the
Town of Sudbury in said County. — Greeting

you are hereby required in the Name of the Common
wealth of Massachusetts, to Notify and warn all the Inhabi-
tants of said Town, Qualified by the Constitution of this
Commonwealth, to Vote in the choice of Representa-
tive and all others Qualified as the Law directs to
Vote in Town affairs to Assemble at the Meeting House
in said Town on Monday the 2^d Day of April next
at 3 O'clock in the afternoon on said day then and
there to act on the following Articles (To-wit) —

- 1st To choose a Moderator
- 2^d To bring in their Votes for some suitable person
for a County Treasurer for the year ensuing
- 3^d To fill Vacancies in those Town officers which the
Law requires should any office appear to be Vacant
- 4th To see if the Town will Act upon the 6th & 12th
Articles in the warning of March Meeting & referred
to April, for further Consideration to do or act —
- 5th To see if the Town will appropriate out of any money
unappropriated now in the Treasury a sum suf-
ficient to pay the demands against the Town for
the support of the poor to do or act —
- 6th To see if the Town will take any Measures for directing
their Constable in future for drawing jurors to do or act
- 7th To see if the Town will choose a Committee to Asertain
the Amount of Money paid into the several Treasuries
by those persons who were exempted from doing Militia
duty by paying in Two Dollars per year it being
agreeable to the request of Capt Nathan Wheeler and
others to do or act —

None of you are not to fail of Making returns of this
warrant with your doing thereon to some one of
the selectmen previous to opening said Meeting
given under our hand & seal at Sudbury of our said
this 20 Day of March A.D. 1821
