At a Legal Meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury in the County of Middlesex & Commonwealth of Massachusetts qualified by the Constitution to vote for Gov^r & Lieut. Governor & Senators & Counsellors of said Commonwealth, holden on Monday the first day of April A.D. 1822. then the Inhabitants proceeded to the business of said day by bringing in their votes ~~part~~ following persons —
