3^d Article put over for the present -

4th Article containing the 7th article in the warning
of March meeting & referred to April for further
consideration the Town voted to adopt the same
measures as was the year past for the collection
of Taxes in said Town -
Then the Town took up the 2nd article in the warning
of March Meeting & referred to April for further consideration
and is contained in this 4th article -
and made choice of Mr Samuel Knight for their
constable for the year ensuing and he appeared before
the Town clerk & took oath that he so proceeded -
Then the Town made choice of Capt Enock Kidder
for their Treas^r the year ensuing & he has taken
the oath proscribed by Law.

Then the Town took up the 6th article in the warning
of March Meeting & referred to April for further
consideration as contained in this 4th article
and the Town voted to except of the settlement of
selectmen with the Town Treas^r & ordered the same to be done
