Middlesex Js. To Mr. Samuel Knight Constable of the
Town of Sudbury in said County. Greeting

You are hereby required in the name of the Commonwealth
of Massachusetts, to Notify & warn all the male Inhabi-
tants of said Town of twenty one years of age & upward except
(paupers and persons under Guardianship) who are qualified
by the Constitution of this Commonwealth to vote in the choice
of Representatives, and all others qualified as the Law directs
to vote in Town affairs to assemble at the Meeting House in
said Town on Monday the 6th Day of May next at 3 O'clock in
the afternoon on said day then & there to act on the
following articles (Viz)

1st To choose a Moderator.

2^d To bring in their votes for some suitable person for
Register of Deed for said County.

3^d To bring in their Town debts and credits.

4th To see if the Town will grant to the Rev^d Rufus Hurlbut
his salary the year ensuing to do or act.

5th To see if the Town will grant Money for the support of a
grammar school for the year ensuing & order where the
same shall be kept to do or act.

6th To see if the Town will grant Money for the support
of a Reading & writing school for the year ensuing
and order where the same shall be kept to do or act.

7th To see if the Town will grant Money for the relief of the
Poor belonging to said Town for the year ensuing to do or act.
