You are hereby required in the name of the Commonwealth
of Massachusetts to notify and warn all the Freeholders and
other Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury Qualified by Law,
to Vote in Town affairs to assemble at the Meeting House in
said Town on Monday the 3^d day of March next next at
12 O'clock at noon on said day then and there to Act on the
following Articles (viz) ~ ~ ~ ~ ~

- 1st To choose a Moderator, Town clerk, Selectmen Town Treasurer
Assessors, Constable, and all other Town Officers required by Law
to be annually chosen in the Month of March or April
- 2^d To see if the Town will repair their Highway by rate the present
year and Grant a suitable sum of money for repairing the same
- 3^d To see if the Town will give liberty for Swine to go at large
the present year ~ ~ ~ ~ ~
- 4th To see if the Town will give liberty for Horses & Mules and
Great Cattle to go at large the present year ~ ~ ~ ~ ~
- 5th To see if the Town will give liberty for Sheep to go at large
- 6th To see if the Town will take the same Measures for the purpose
of Collecting the Taxes that may be Assessed upon the Inhabitants of
said Town as was adapted year past, and to agree with some
suitable person or persons to collect the same for the year
ensuing to do or act as the Town shall think best when met ~
- 7th To see if the Town will appoint some suitable Persons for a
School Committee and authorise them to agree with and hire
School Instructors and Instructeris to instruct all the ^{public} schools
in said Town for the year ensuing to do or act ~ ~ ~ ~ ~
- 8th To see if the Town will attend to the report of the trustees of
the Sudbury Ministerial fund Corporation the State
of the fund and the Interest arising thereon ~ ~ ~ ~ ~
- 9th To see if the Town will act upon the 4th article in the warning
of last November Meeting & put over to the next Meeting
for further consideration ~ ~ ~ ~ ~
