Ls. You are hereby required in the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, to notify and warn all the Inhabitants of said Town qualified by Law as provided by the Constitution of this Commonwealth to vote in the choice of Governor Lieutenant Governor and Senators for the year ensuing to assemble at the Meeting House in said Town on Monday the 7th day of April next at 1. O'clock in the afternoon on said day then and there to give in their votes for the choice of Gov^r Lieut. Governor of said Commonwealth and Senators for the Middlesex District for the year ensuing.

Hence of you are not to fail of making return of this warrant with your doings thereon to some one of the Selectmen one hour at least ^{before} the opening of said Meeting given under our hands and seal this twentieth day of March A.D. 1823.
