1823. The Town proceeded upon the business of said ^{day} and took up

8th the Town voted that the Selectmen should see to the
letting out and taking care of the Meeting house and
digging graves attending funerals &c.

9th The Town voted to chuse an agent as was expressed in
the said Article and Capt Isaac Gibbs was appointed for
that purpose

10th The Committee appointed at the last March Meeting for
the purpose of expediting of building a poor house in the
Town of Sudbury reported as follows That after due
enquiry and a thorough investigation of the subject your Com=
mittee are of an opinion that it will not be for the Towns
Interest to erect a poor house at present, the report was accepted
