for the year ensuing to assemble at the Meeting House in  
said Town on Monday the 5th day of April next at one  
o'clock in the afternoon on said day, then and there  
to give in their votes for the choice of Governor and  
Lieut. Governor of said Commonwealth and Senators  
for the Middlesex District for the ensuing Political year

Hence of you are not to fail of making return of this  
warrant with doings thereon to some one of the select-  
men before the time set for opening said Meeting
