At a legal Meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury
in the County of Middlesex and Commonwealth of Massa-
chusetts Qualified by the Constitution to Vote for Governor
Lieut. Governor and Senators and Councillors for said
Commonwealth holden on Monday the 5th day of April
A.D. 1824. When the Inhabitants then the Inhabitants
